



# FOWEY CLASSICS

## NOTICE OF RACE 2026

The organising authority is Fowey Sailing Committee (FSC) which is the operating name of the Port of Fowey Race Organising Committee (POFROC), an unaffiliated body owned and controlled by the Royal Fowey Yacht Club (RFYC) and Fowey Gallants Sailing Club (FGSC) in association with Fowey Classics.

### 1. Rules

- 1.1 Racing will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2 Rule 44.1 will be changed so that only one turn, including one tack and one gybe is required. The sailing instructions may change other rules.
- 1.3 The Fowey Harbour Byelaws and Notices to Mariners published by the Fowey Harbour Commissioners (FHC) apply both within the harbour and the approaches to it. The Byelaws are available to view on the FHC website - <https://foweyharbour.co.uk/publications/>.
- 1.4 All boats shall have an effective alternative means of propulsion for safety purposes.

### 2. Eligibility and Entry

- 2.1 Racing in Fowey Classics is open to boats of the following classes. Gaff rig includes gunter, lugsail, spritsail and any other boat with a four-sided mainsail. Multi masted boats shall sail in the class appropriate to their type of mainsail. The organising authority reserves the right to allocate boats to classes and to amalgamate, cancel, divide or rearrange classes at its discretion depending on entries received.

1	Gaff Rigged Yachts 30ft LOA & over
2	Gaff Rigged Yachts 20ft – 29ft 11” LOA
3	Bermudan Rigged Yachts 35ft LOA & over
4	Bermudan Rigged Yachts 20ft – 34ft 11” LOA
5	Sailing Craft, Gaff or Bermudan Rigged under 20ft
6	Sailing Dinghies

- 2.2 Entry in Fowey Classics shall be by completion of the Entry Form and payment of the relevant fee as indicated on the Entry Form.
- 2.3 A share of the paid entry fee for each boat shall constitute membership of POFROC for the purposes of racing in the Port of Fowey.

### 3. Handicapping

- 3.1 Gaffers and Luggers will be scored using an OGA handicap which may be obtained free by completing the measurement form available from Fowey Classics website.
- 3.2 Bermudan rigged yachts should obtain a handicap prior to entry free on Jauge Classique Handicap (JCH) [www.jch-online.org](http://www.jch-online.org). Entrants are encouraged to complete and submit the necessary forms as early as possible.

### 4. Schedule of Races

The schedule is shown in the attached programme for the event.

## 5. Sailing Instructions

Sailing instructions and instructions for the Parade of Sail will be available online on the Fowey Classics website from 19<sup>th</sup> July 2026. No boat shall race until its entry has been accepted.

## 6. Venue & Courses

**6.1** Racing will take place in Fowey Bay and Fowey Harbour.

**6.2** The Parade of Sail will take place inside Fowey Harbour.

## 7. Penalty System

The founder of Fowey Classics, the late Rusty Eplett, established a fundamental rule for the event that any boat protesting shall be disqualified. If the Race Management team observes any competitor to be in breach of RRS then at the discretion of the Race Committee that boat shall have 10 minutes added to her elapsed time.

## 8. Prizes

Details of prizes will appear in the Classics event programme.

## 9. Risk Statement

Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone." Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (e) The provision of a race management team, safety patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the organising authority does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) The provision of safety patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- (g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.

## 10. Insurance

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.

## 11. RYA Racing Charter

Competitors should note that FSC has implemented the RYA Racing Charter and that, when entering, competitors will be required to undertake to sail in compliance with the Charter, which can be found at the front of the RYA Racing Rules of Sailing 2025-2028 or at <https://www.rya.org.uk/racingrules>.

## 12. Media Rights

Competitors automatically grant to the organising authority and a party to which they may delegate this right, without payment, the right in perpetuity to make, use or show (including via the internet), any motion pictures, still pictures, live, taped or filmed television or any other forms of media, of or relating to the event.

## 13. Further Information

### The West Country Classics Series 2026

Vessels that have a minimum length on deck of 5.5m (18ft) LOD or displacement vessels with centreboards will be eligible for the series.
